Popular Name

An Amendment to the Arkansas Constitution Reducing the Number of Constitutional Amendments the General Assembly Can Propose.

Ballot Title

A proposed amendment to the Arkansas Constitution that reduces from three (3) to one (1) the number of proposed amendments to the Constitution that the General Assembly, at a regular session, can refer to the electors.

Text of Proposed Amendment

Arkansas Constitution, Article 19, §22 is amended to read as follows:

§ 22. Constitutional amendments.

Either branch of the General Assembly, at a regular session thereof, may propose <u>an</u> amendments to this Constitution; and if the same be agreed to by a majority of all members elected to each house, such proposed amendments shall be entered on the journals with the yeas and nays, and published in at least one newspaper in each county, where a newspaper is published, for six months immediately preceding the next general election for Senators and Representatives, at which time the same shall be submitted to the electors of the State, for approval or rejection; and if a majority of the electors voting at such election adopt such amendments, the same shall become a part of this Constitution. <u>But no No</u> more than three amendments <u>one amendment</u> shall be proposed or submitted at the same time. They shall be so submitted as to enable the electors to vote on each amendment separately.
